

**MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
HELD AT SCOTT CITY HALL
THURSDAY, May 6, 2021 AT 6:00 PM**

The Mayor and City Council Members met in Regular Session, Thursday, May 6, 2021, all Councilmen were present.

Councilman Hollier led the Prayer and Pledge.

Councilman Montoucet motioned to accept the minutes from the April 1, 2021 meeting as written. Seconded by Councilman Hollier, motion approved.

Councilman Bergeron motioned to accept the March 2021 Financial Statement. Seconded by Councilman Hollier.

The Mayor's Report: Mayor Richard thanked the National Day of Prayer Committee for putting together another successful program. A Town Hall will be held on Wednesday, May 26th, 2021 at 6pm to discussion drainage. The City has been awarded another LCDBG grant for \$315,000 with a City match of \$85,000 to upgrade sewer in the older section of downtown.

Mayor President Josh Guillory briefly gave an update on current events and invited any public questions or concerns regarding the parish. No comments were made.

Dr. Robert Richard, President of the Le Jumelage' presented a new campaign with one of our twinning cities. Please visit our city website for more details.

Mayor Richard recognized Cub Scouts Pack 451 for their participation in the "Sweep Scott" Campaign. The club helped pick up litter and marked storm drains.

Councilman Boudreaux motioned to adopt Resolution 2021-14, a Resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute a cooperative endeavor agreement by and between the City of Scott and Scott Area Team Sports, Inc (SATS) for the operation and maintenance of Scott Park. Lafayette Consolidated Government gave the City of Scott \$643,000 to be used for capital improvements and operations. SATS Board will continue to operate the recreational programs and local tournaments as done in the past. Seconded by Councilman Suire, motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Montoucet motioned to grant a variance, Section 8-163 Prohibition of recreational Park trailers- to allow the parking of a recreational trailer until December 31, 2021 at 132 Lloyd Street due to a fire that destroyed his home. Mr. Perry Boudreaux, property owner sincerely thanked everyone involved. Seconded by Councilman Suire, motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Richard explained that the Best Stop Holding Company and ADDP, CO. is requesting an Industrial Tax Exemption. Councilman Bergeron asked to file an extension and add to the June 3, 2021 Agenda. All present were in agreement.


Councilman Bergeron motioned to adopt Resolution 2021-16, A Resolution authorizing the mayor to renew the contract for emergency and non-emergency ground ambulance services between the City of Scott and Acadian Ambulance Service, INC. Mr. Troy Guidry, Acadian Ambulance representative state that has been 841 emergency calls the company has been able to assist with over the past 11 months. Chief Chad Sonnier stated that there was no issues. Seconded by Councilman Hollier, motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Bergeron motioned to amend the budget in the revenue line item for a State Farm grant reimbursement, "Buckle Up Phone Down" public safety campaign signs. No discussion. Seconded by Councilman Montoucet, motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business, meeting adjourned at 7:00pm.
